(13) Citizenship. The student understands important symbols, customs, and celebrations that represent American beliefs and principles that contribute to our national identity. The student is expected to: explain state and national patriotic symbols, including the United States; recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States and explain how patriotic customs and celebrations reflect American individualism and freedom.

Jane Hampton Cook's book, *The Pledge to the Flag*, reveals the story of the Pledge of Allegiance.

(15) Science, technology, and society. The student identifies individuals who created or invented new technology and understands how technology affects daily life, past and present. The student is expected to: (A) (B) (C) (16) describe how technology has affected the ways families live; describe how technology has affected communication, transportation, and recreation.

History. The student understands the historical significance of landmarks and celebrations in the community, state, and nation. The student is expected to: (A) (B) explain the significance of various community, state, and national celebrations such as **Veterans Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day**, and **Thanksgiving**; and identify and explain the significance of various community, state, and national landmarks such as monuments and government buildings.

Jane Hampton Cook's books, My American Flag, America the Beautiful, My Country 'Tis of Thee, and What's True about the Red, White and Blue? feature Independence Day. America the Beautiful features images of Thanksgiving. My American Flag features a child dressed as a soldier and a solemn image of a flag at a gravestone for Memorial Day.

Citizenship. The student understands characteristics of good citizenship as exemplified by historical figures and other individuals. The student is expected to: (A) (B) (C) identify characteristics of good citizenship, including truthfulness, justice, equality, respect for oneself and others.

Jane Hampton Cook's What's True about the Red, White and Blue? shows that the color blue in the flag means justice.

Citizenship. The student understands important symbols, customs, and celebrations that represent American beliefs and principles that contribute to our national identity. The student is expected to: (A) (B) (C) recite the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag and the Pledge to the Texas Flag; sing, recite, or identify selected patriotic songs, including "The Star-Spangled Banner" and "America the Beautiful."

- (5) Throughout social studies in Kindergarten-Grade 12, students build a foundation in history; geography; economics; government; citizenship; culture; science, technology, and society; and social studies skills. The content, as appropriate for the grade level or course, enables students to understand the importance of patriotism.
- (7) State and federal laws mandate a variety of celebrations and observances, including Celebrate Freedom Week. (A) (B) Each social studies class shall include, during Celebrate Freedom Week as provided under the TEC, §29.907, concerning the intent, meaning, and importance of the Declaration of Independence and the U.S. Constitution.

(A) Each social studies class shall include, during Celebrate Freedom Week as provided under the TEC, §29.907, or during another full school week as determined by the board of trustees of a school district, appropriate instruction concerning the intent, meaning, and importance of the Declaration of Independence and the U.S. Constitution, including the Bill of Rights, in their historical contexts. The study of the Declaration of Independence must include the study of the relationship of the ideas expressed in that document to subsequent American history, including the relationship of its ideas to the rich diversity of our people as a nation of immigrants, the American Revolution, the formulation of the U.S. Constitution, and the abolitionist movement, which led to the Emancipation Proclamation and the women's suffrage movement.

Jane Hampton Cook's books *America the Beautiful* and *What's True about the Red, White, and Blue?* feature content related to the American Revolution, including heroes such as George Washington, Peter Salem, Thomas Jefferson and Susan B. Anthony.

(5) History. Identify the accomplishments and contributions of individuals and groups such as Susan B. Anthony and Martin Luther King Jr.

What's True about the Red, White and Blue? features Susan B. Anthony and Martin Luther King, Jr. King is also included in Cook's book, My Country 'Tis of Thee.

(16) Explain various patriotic symbols or recite "The Star-Spangled Banner" and explain its history; recite and explain the meaning of the Pledge of Allegiance to the United States Flag; and explain the significance of important landmarks, including the White House, the Statue of Liberty, and Mount Rushmore.
